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Northern Wetlands Walk. 1.8 km. return.
The Northern Wetlands Walk is suitable for many levels of fitness. It runs through the recycled water and transpiration area where high quality treated effluent is irrigated into the rainforest and wetlands. The naturalised water eventually flows into Obi Obi Creek. This is an outstanding flora and fauna habitat which won a prestigious UN World Environment Day (business) Award in 2015 shared by Unity Water and Green Hills. 'Fairview' and the Pattemore family.
John and Emily Pattemore moved from Tilba Tilba in N.S.W. to Maleny in 1907. Drought in N.S.W. had forced many dairy farming families to seek land with more reliable rainfall. The Pattemores farmed this land for 41 years until 1948. In 1995 Caloundra City Council purchased the farm from the Armstrong family who acquired the farm in 1969. The Council purchased Stephen Porter's farm in 2004. This was to form the basis for the development of the Maleny Community Precinct of which a detailed Master Plan was endorsed by the Sunshine Coast Regional Council in 2010. The Maleny Trail and Wetlands Walk are just two of the exciting outcomes from this initiative. **Historic "Fairview", the Pattemore's farm house, is open to the public on the last Saturday of the month from 1pm to 4pm and every Friday from 10am to 12 noon.**

Trees along the trail.
The Maleny Green Hills Fund have planted in excess of 54,000 trees and native plants along the trail assisted and supplied by Barung Landcare. Unitywater has developed the irrigated hill forests and wetlands habitats. The Maleny Golf Club has undertaken tree plantings and introduced native plants to support endangered butterflies. This continues to be a wonderful community effort. The walks and trails are maintained with the generous support of Council and an enthusiastic band of dedicated volunteers.

- 1-2 Maleny Showgrounds to Maleny Boardwalk: 600m
 - 2-3 Boardwalk to Platypus Viewing Area: 900m
 - 3-4 Platypus Viewing Area to end path: 100m
 - 4-5 End path to Obi Picnic area: 1,500m
 - 5-6 Obi Picnic Area to Reynolds Circuit: 1,000m
 - 6-7 Reynolds Circuit to Fairview: 700m
